From the Pastor's Desk



"3 If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God.² Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth.3 For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God.⁴ When Christ, who is our life, shall appear, then shall ye also appear with him in glory. 5 Mortify therefore your members which are upon the earth; fornication, uncleanness, inordinate affection, evil concupiscence, and covetousness, which is idolatry: For which things' sake the wrath of God cometh on the children of disobedience:7 In the which ye also walked some time, when ye lived in them.8 But now ye also put off all these; anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy communication out of your mouth.9 Lie not one to another, seeing that ve have put off the old man with his deeds; 10 And have put on the new man, which is renewed in knowledge after the image of him that created him: 11 Where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcision nor uncircumcision. Barbarian, bond nor free: but Christ is all, and in all. 12 Put on therefore, as the elect of

cies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering;¹³ Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye. 14 And above all these things put on charity, which is the bond of perfectness.15 And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to the which also ye are called in one body; and be ye thankful.16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. 17 And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by him." Colossians 3:1-17

This portion of Paul's letter to the Colossians begins with these words: "If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above". These words are not an instruction to climb our way to heaven, nor are they a call to abandon our earthly responsibilities. Rather, Paul is reminding us of who we are in Christ and whose we are. It's about the condition of our hearts. It's about our goals, hopes, and dreams. Jesus said "33 But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you." -Matthew 6:33

In baptism, God buried the old Adam and raised us with Christ. The gospel doesn't tell us what we might become if we try

God, holy and beloved, bowels of mer- hard enough. It tells us what God has cies, kindness, humbleness of mind, already done. He chose you. He clothed meekness, longsuffering, 13 Forbearing you. He forgives you.

With the resurrection of the new man comes the daily death of the old. "Mortify therefore your members which are upon the earth Paul writes. Put them to death. These things are remnants of death, the old rags of the old man who has no part in Christ. The Christian life is one of daily repentance, a daily drowning of the old self so that the new might rise as Luther writes in his Small Catechism.

As new creatures in Christ he calls us to clothe ourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Notice also how he describes our lives. Not in solitude. Not cloistered in a monastery, but in community. "16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord". We are members of his body and are nourished by the true vine. Christ is present in all our vocations to serve his people. Husbands and wives, fathers and mothers, workers and neighbors, teachers, carpenters, farmers and students. Whatever our station in life we live out this new identity together and are served by Jesus in our ordinary

St. James the Great Day

St. James the Great Day is a holiday observed on July 25th in the Western Church and on April 30th in the Eastern Church. Also known as the Feast of Saint James the Apostle, this day commemorates the patron saint of Spain on the day his body was miraculously discovered in Compostela, Spain.

Apostle James was one of the 12 apostles recruited by Jesus Christ. Jesus recruited him while he was fishing on the Sea of Galilee with his brother John. After the death of Jesus, his travels to spread the gospel took him to Spain.

Make Me a Channel of Your Peace, a song based on the Prayer of Saint Francis, tells a story of seeking inner peace and becoming an instrument of God's love and peace in the world. The song's roots lie in a prayer attributed to Saint Francis of Assisi, though it wasn't found in his writings. It gained popularity during and after both World Wars, often used to promote peace. The song was set to music by Sebastian Temple.

Seeking Humility and Divine Guidance: The song begins with a plea to be made a channel of God's peace, indicating a desire to be used by a higher power for good.

Focus on Positive Transformation: The lyrics highlight a shift from negativity to positivity. The singer asked to bring hope where there is despair, light where there is darkness, and joy where there is sadness. The Power of Giving and Forgiveness: The song emphasizes the reciprocal nature of giving and receiving, as well as the importance of forgiveness in finding peace.

Eternal Life and Purpose: The closing lines connect the earthly journey with a greater, eternal purpose, suggesting that through acts of service and love, individuals are born into eternal life.

> Make me a channel of your peace, Where there is hatred, let me bring your love; Where there is injury, your healing power, And where there's doubt, true faith in you. 2. Make me a channel of your peace, Where there's despair in life let me bring hope; Where there is darkness, only light, And where there's sadness, ever joy. 3. O, Spirit, grant that I may never seek So much to be consoled as to console. To be understood as to understand, To be loved as to love with all my soul. 4. Make me a channel of your peace; It is in pardoning that we are pardoned, In giving to all that we receive, And in dying that we're born to eternal life.
