"I have yet many things to say unto you, but ye cannot bear them now. Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come. He shall glorify me: for he shall receive of mine, and shall shew it unto you. All things that the Father hath are mine: therefore said I, that he shall take of mine, and shall shew it unto you." -John 16:12-15

This reading from John is the appointed text for Trinity Sunday. A day set aside for us to reflect on the nature of our Lord. The Athanasian Creed, which we will recite

on Trinity Sunday, states: **"That we worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance. For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is another. But the Godhead of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit is one: the glory equal, the majesty coeternal."** Jesus says **"All things that the Father hath are mine"**. This is one of the proofs that show us that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are one, yet also separate. This isn't logical, but it's a truth revealed in the scripture, taught by the Apostles, and confessed by the church for thousands of years.

May we find the time to marvel at our wonderful God this Trinity Sunday.

The Sunday School Program was held May 15.



The years of the 1870's had been filled with tragedy when Horatio Spafford, a forty-three year old Chicago businessman, penned the following hymn. He and his wife were still grieving over the death of their son when the Great Chicago Fire struck and caused them financial disaster. He realized that his family needed to get away, so he decided to take his wife and four daughters to England. His wife and daughters went ahead on the SS Ville du Havre; he planned to follow in a few days. But on the Atlantic the ship was struck by another ship and sank within twelve minutes. More than two hundred lives were lost, including the Spaffords' four daughters. When the survivors were brought to shore at Cardiff, Wales, Mrs Spafford cabled her husband with the words, "Saved alone..."

He booked passage on the next ship. It was while crossing the Atlantic near where his daughters drowned, that Spafford penned the words to the hymn, "It Is Well with my Soul." Perhaps we cannot always say that everything is well in all aspects of our lives. There will always be storms and trials to face. But with faith in a loving God and with trust in His divine help, we can say, "It is well, it is well with my soul!"

When peace like a river attendeth my way,
When sorrows like sea billows roll;
What ever my lot, Thou hast taught
me to say, It is well, it is well with my soul."

Though Satan should buffet, tho' trials should come,
Let this blest assurance control,
That Christ has regarded my helpless estate,
And hath shed His own blood for my soul.

He lives, O, the bliss of this glorious thought,
My sin not in part but the whole,
Is nailed to the cross and I bear it
no more, Praise the Lord, praise the Lord, O my soul!
